Dues are \$8.00 per membership year which runs from September 1 to August 31.


The club newsletter will be published every two months from September to June.

# ATA Launches Stamp Checklist Database



# If there was ever a time to join the American Topical Association, that time is now!

The ATA has launched the biggest benefit to stamp collectors in its 65-year history. A five-year undertaking has resulted in doubling the number of its topical checklists to nearly 1200. The lists are being produced from a regularly updated database that now contains almost 400,000 stamps and 578,502 topical listings.

ATA checklists, available in a spreadsheet format or printed, include the country, date of issue, Scott number, denomination and a description of what is depicted on the stamp. They are invaluable to topical collectors in researching and acquiring stamps. In some cases, meter stamps, postmarks, postal stationery and other items are included. Lists will be regularly updated, and members have the option to receive annual updates.

Checklists are only available to individual ATA members at a nominal price. Cost is a penny per item on the checklist – with Mini-lists for 50¢ and Maxi-lists over 5,000 for \$50. Membership information is available at

www. americantopicalassn.org or by calling the ATA office at 618-985-5100. Membership includes six issues of *Topical Time* which is printed in full color. Currently dues are \$30 a year for both the print and digital editions of *Topical Time* and \$25 a year just for the digital edition.

# ★ Answers – March/April Philatelic Quiz ★

Q1. What United States President made an undersea voyage on *Plunger*, a submarine built by John Holland whose submarine USS Holland has been pictured on a United States postage stamp?

#### Ans. President Theodore Roosevelt.

In 2000 the United States Postal Service isued a booklet pane of five stamps celebrating the centenary of the Navy's submarine service. One of the stamps shows the USS Holland, the first submarine purchased by the United States Navy in 1900. It was launched in 1898 by John Philip Holland (1840–1914), an Irish engineer. On August 25, 1905, President Theodore Roosevelt spent 70 minutes underwater in *Plunger*, a submarine also built by John Holland in the 1890s.

Q2. What two native animals appear on the Australian coat-of-arms.

#### Ans. Red Kangaroo and Emu

The red kangaroo (*Macropus rufus*) is the largest native mammal in Australia and is found throughout the country. The flightless emu (Dromaius novaehollandiae) is the second-largest bird, by height, in the world today and is native to Australia. It is common over most of Australia.

Q3. Who was the American architect that designed the Australian city of Canberra?

#### Ans. Walter Burley Griffin

Canberra is the capital city of Australia and was designed by a husband and wife team of Chicago Architects, Walter Burley Griffin and Marion Mahony Griffin. When the

Confederation of Australia was created in 1901, it was decided to build a new city for the capital rather than use Sydney or Melbourne. Griffins' plan, using geometric motifs and incorporating the site's natural vegetation and topography, was chosen and construction was

begun in 1913. As it took years to complete the construction, of the city, the legislature did not move from Melbourne until 1927.

Australia recently issued a pair of stamps celebrating the centennial of the founding of Canberra. The stamps show Australia's Parliament House and the National Portrait Gallery and in the background the original architectural plan for the city.

Q4. What sport was honored on an envelope issued in

Milwaukee, Wisconsin?

Ans. Bowling.

The embossed 8-cent commemorative envelope was issued in Milwaukee, Wisconsin, on August 21, 1971, the opening day of the 7th World Tournament of the the International Bowling Federation.




Indicium of 6 \(^4\) envelope. United States 1971 (Scott U563)

Q5. What United States postage stamp depicts a sculpture by Bruce Wilder Saville?

#### Ans. Battle of Fallen Timbers (Scott 680)

On September 14, 1929, the United States Post Office issued a 2-cent commemorative stamp on the 135th anniversary of the Battle of Fallen Timbers. The day of issue was the



The Battle of Fallen Timbers took place in 1794 near present-day Toledo, Ohio, where General Anthony Wayne (1745–1796) defeated an Indian Confederation supported by the British. The result was peace with the Indians in Northwestern Ohio and the withdrawl of British military from the area. The monument shows General Wayne in the center, a frontiersman to his left and an Indian to his right.
